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FOREWORD



The Malawi Government through the National Statistical Office (NSO) conducted its sixth Population and Housing Census (PHC) in September 2018. The 2018 PHC was the first one to be conducted using Computer Assisted Personal Interviewing (CAPI) technology. Data was collected and captured on tablets and transmitted to NSO server electronically via internet. The process proved to be efficient as it reduced time for data processing and cleaning since these processes were mostly done at data capturing stage. The preliminary and main reports were produced in a record time of 3 and 7 months, respectively.

In order to increase the utilization and to enhance understanding of the census data, NSO has prepared Neno district report aimed at providing summary findings of the 2018 Population and Housing Census. The district report has been written by officers from NSO. This report is among the dissemination products published by the NSO. Others include preliminary and main census reports and thematic reports.

I would like to acknowledge the support NSO has received from the Government, Development Partners, the Private Sector and individuals for the census. Specifically, I wish to thank UNFPA for providing funding and coordinating support from all Development Partners. I also wish to thank DFID, USAID, the Norwegian Government, GIZ, the Irish Aid, Iceland Government, the Peoples' Republic of China, the UN Family and the Standard Bank for providing financial resources for the 2018 PHC.

I am heavily indebted to all NSO staff, Census Zone Managers, Census District Supervisors, Control Centre Supervisors, Field Supervisors and Enumerators for their dedication and hard work during the 2018 PHC. 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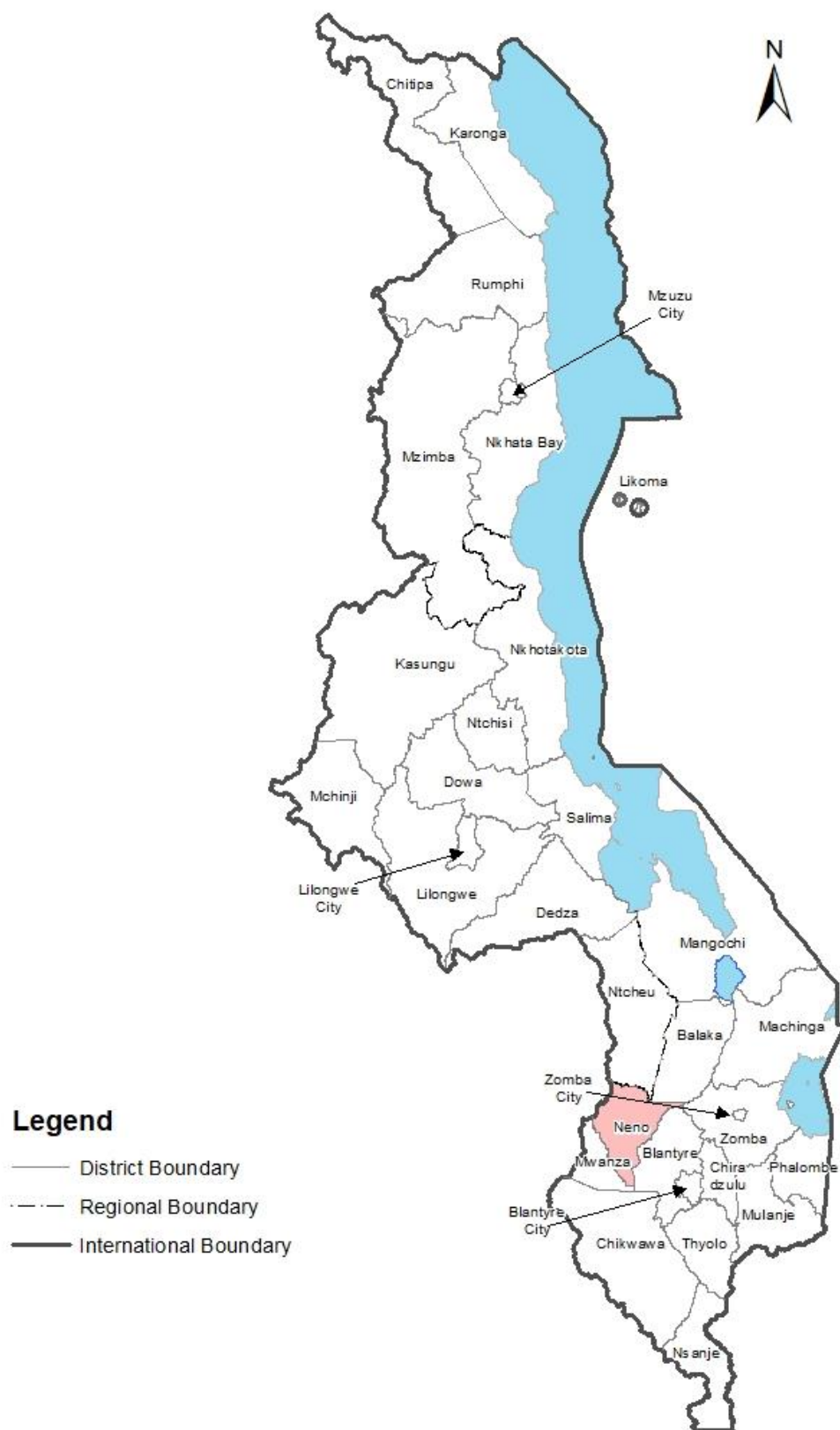
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Map of Malawi Showing Neno District boundary

1 Population Size and Growth

1.1 Population size

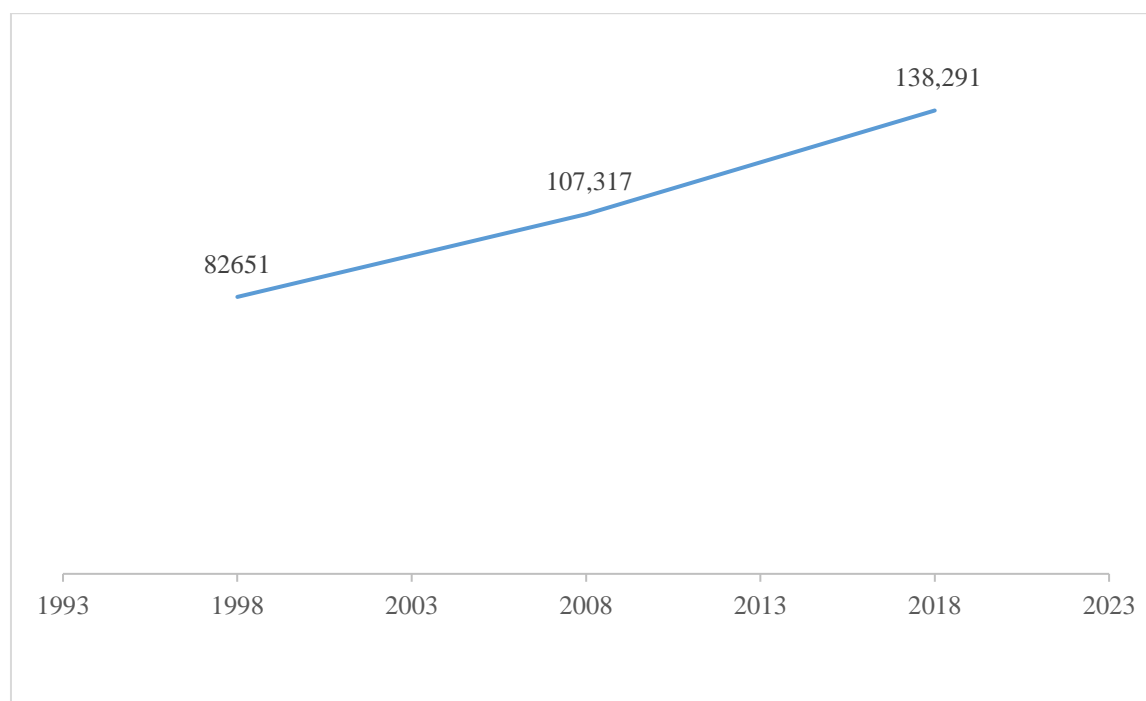
The 2018 Population and Housing Census enumerated a total of 17,563,749 persons in Malawi. Southern Region contributed 44.1 percent of the population (7,750,629 persons) while Neno district contributed 0.8 percent of the population of Malawi (138,291 persons).

Neno district had 67,357 males and 70,934 females, representing 48.7 percent and 51.3 percent of the total population, respectively. By computation the sex ratio for Neno is 95; meaning that for every 100 females there were 95 males. Neno Boma had the highest sex ratio at 99 while TA Dambe had the lowest at 90 (Table 1.1).

1.2 Intercensal Annual Growth Rates

The annual intercensal growth rate for Malawi has increased from 2.8 to 2.9 percent from 2008 to 2018. For Neno district, the annual intercensal growth rate has decreased from 2.7 in 2008 to 2.5 in 2018. The population of Neno has grown from 107,317 in 2008 to 138,291 in 2018 reflecting a population change of 30,974 persons. (Figure 1.1)

1.3 Population Distribution by Traditional Authority

At traditional authority (TA) level, TA Symon Likongwe had the largest population size of 43,657 persons representing 31.6 percent of Neno population, whereas Neno Boma had the smallest population size of 2,283 persons representing 1.7 percent of Neno population (Table 1.1).

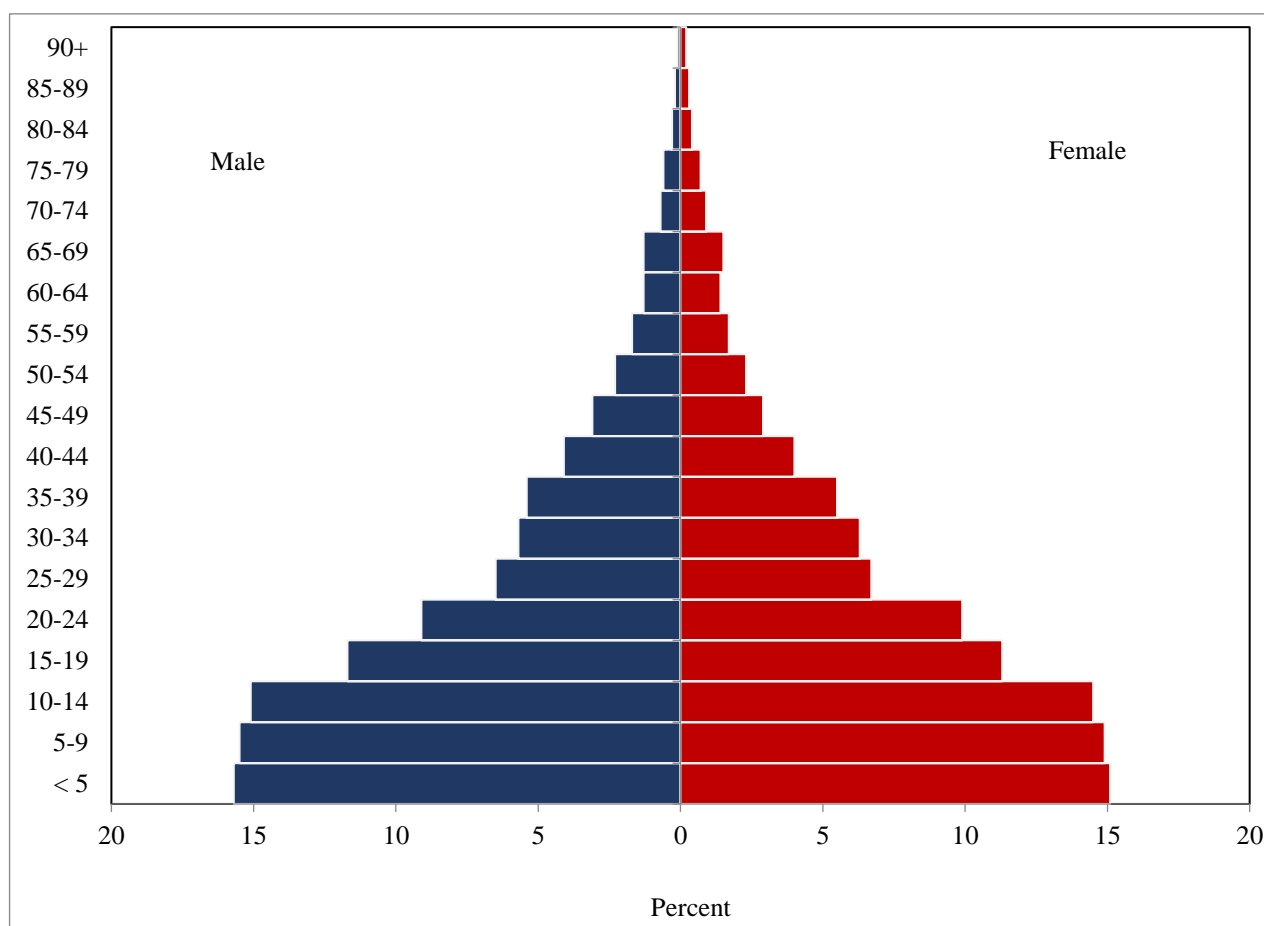
1.4 Age and Sex Distribution

Age and sex are the most basic characteristics of a population. Every population has a different age and sex distribution. The number and proportion of males and females in each age group can have considerable impact on the population's social and economic situation, both present and future.

A population pyramid graphically displays a population's age and sex composition. Each year a new cohort is born and appears at the bottom of the pyramid, while the cohorts above move up. As the cohorts age, they lose members because of death and may gain or lose members because of migration.

The age and sex pyramid shows that Neno district has a younger population, characteristic of prevalence of high fertility (Figure 1.2).

1.5 Population Distribution by Special Age Groups

Among special age groups there were 33,124 primary school going persons (age 6-13 years); 13,160 secondary school going persons (age 14-17 years); 68,440 youth age 10-35 years; 32,949 women of childbearing age (15-49 years); 66,612 persons aged 18 years and older and 6,834 elderly population age 60 years and older.

TA Symon Likongwe had the highest number of children under 5 years while Neno Boma had the least number of children under 5 years. There were 10,228 primary school going children and 4,152 secondary school going children in TA Symon Likongwe. Neno Boma had the least number of primary and secondary going age children.

In terms of women of child bearing age (15-49 years), persons aged 18 years and older and the elderly population (60 years +), TA Symon Likongwe had more numbers than the rest of the TAs in Neno district (Table 1.2)

1.6 Population Density

Population density refers to the average number of persons per square kilometre. The population density for Neno district has increased from 42 persons per square kilometre in 2008, to 89 in 2018.

Neno Boma has the density of 931 persons per square kilometre. Among the TAs, TA Symon Likongwe has the highest density of 105 persons per square kilometre (Table 1.3) while TA Mlauli is the least densely populated area with 32 persons per square kilometre.

1.7 Household size

The average household size is calculated as the ratio of the total household population to the total number of households in an area. The average household size for Neno district was 4.4 in 2018. This means that on average, a household in Neno had 4.4 members. The average household size for Malawi was 4.6 and 4.4 for the Southern Region.

Among the TAs of Neno, TA Dambe had the highest average household size of 4.7 while Neno Boma has the lowest average household size of 4.0, followed by TA Symon Likongwe (4.2). (Table 1.4).

2 Fertility and Mortality Rates

The 2018 Population and Housing Census collected data on population dynamics such as fertility and mortality. This information is important for analysis and estimating fertility and mortality indicators, namely Crude Birth Rate (CBR), Total Fertility Rate (TFR), Crude Death Rate (CDR), Infant Mortality Rate (IMR), Under five Mortality Rate (U5MR) and life expectancy.

The Crude Birth Rate (CBR) is defined as number of births that occurred in a particular year per 1,000 population. The Crude birth rate for Neno district is 35 births per 1000 population which is higher than the rate for Malawi (33) and the Southern region (34).

The Total Fertility Rate (TFR) is defined as the number of births a woman would have if she survived to the end of her childbearing age, which ranges from 15-49 years, and experienced the current observed age-specific fertility rates. The Total Fertility Rate for Neno district is estimated at 4.5 children per woman. This is higher than the rate for Malawi (4.2) and the Southern Region (4.3).

Crude Death Rate (CDR) is defined as the number of deaths that occurred in a given calendar year per 1,000 population. For Neno district, the Crude death rate for was at 12.7 deaths per 1000 population in 2018. The CDR for Neno district is higher than for Malawi (6.3) and for the Southern region (6.7).

The Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) measures the probability of dying before the first birthday. The IMR for Neno district is 27 deaths per 1000 live births.

The under-five Mortality Rate measures the probability of dying between birth and exact age five. The Under-five Mortality Rate for Neno district is 40 deaths per 1000 live births, which is lower than U5MR for Malawi (44 deaths per 1000 live births) and the U5MR for Southern Region (42 deaths per 1000 live births) (Table 2.1).

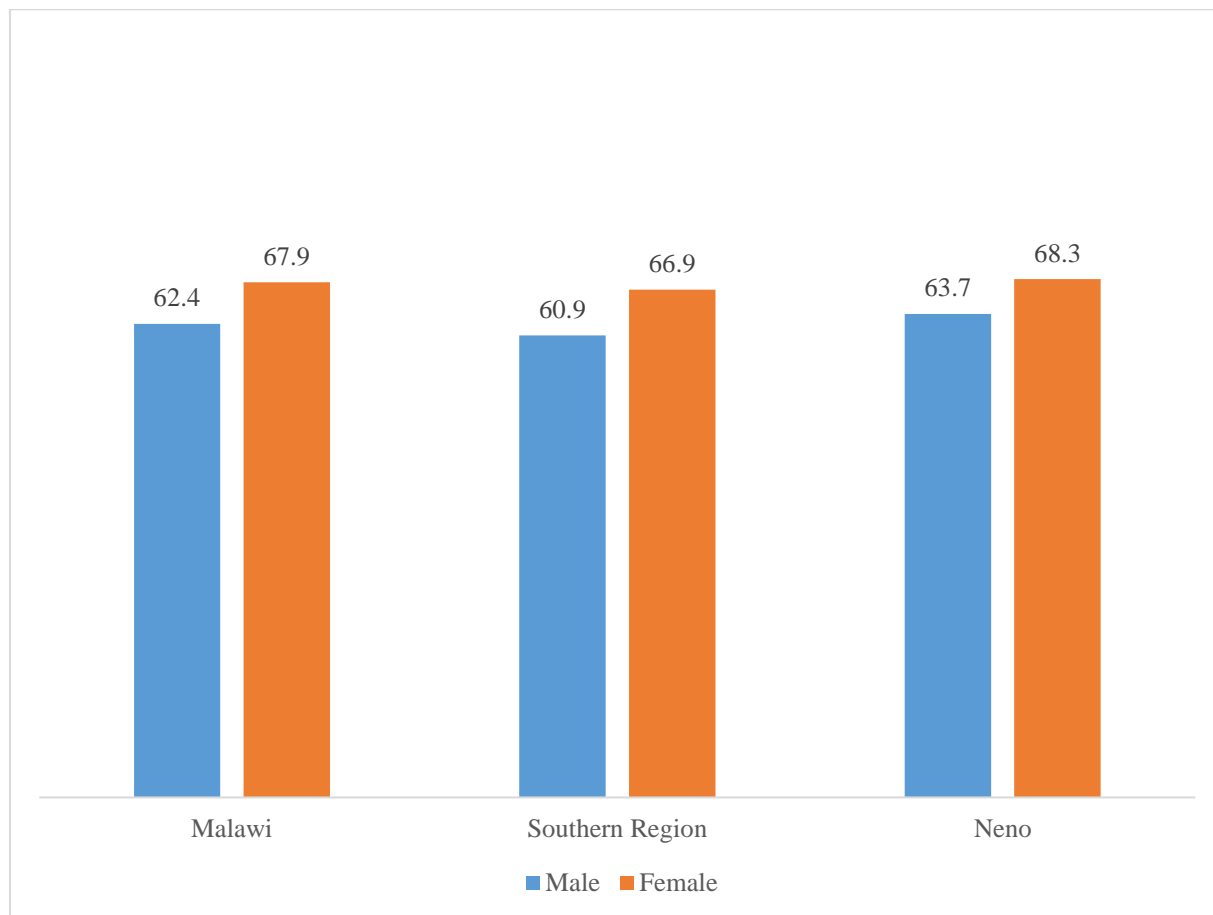
Life expectancy at birth is defined as the average number of years that a newborn could expect to live if he or she were to pass through life subject to the age-specific mortality rates of a given period. At national level, life expectancy for males is 62.4 years and for females is 67.9 years; while for the Southern region life expectancy for males is 60.9 years and for females is 66.9 years and for Neno district the life expectancy for males is 61.3 years and females is 67.3 years (Figure 2.1).

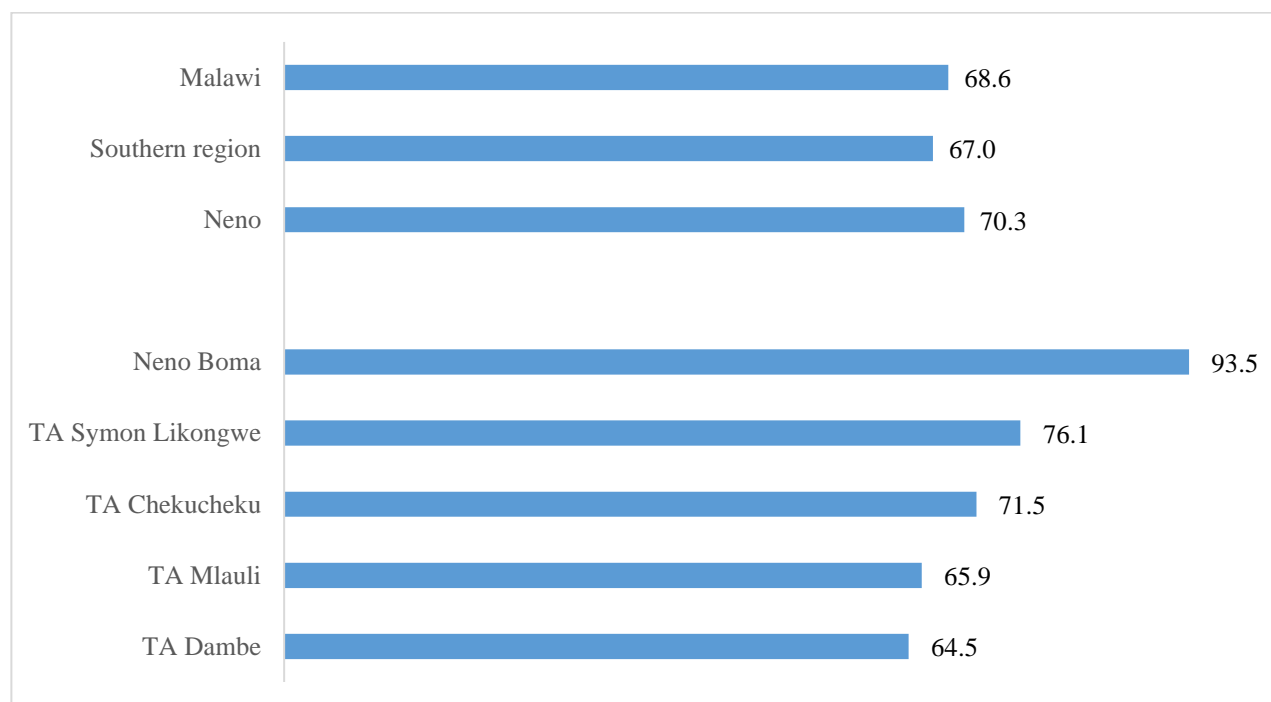
3 Literacy and Education

3.1 Literacy

Literacy is defined as the ability by person aged 5 years and over to read and write a simple sentence in any language. In Neno district, 70.3 percent of the enumerated persons belonging to the age band of interest were reportedly literate (Figure 3.1).

Across the Traditional Authority areas, Neno Boma had the highest literacy rate at 93.5 percent, whereas TA Dambe had the lowest at 64.5 percent (Figure 3.1).

Figure 3.1: Literacy Rates by TA, Neno, 2018 PHC



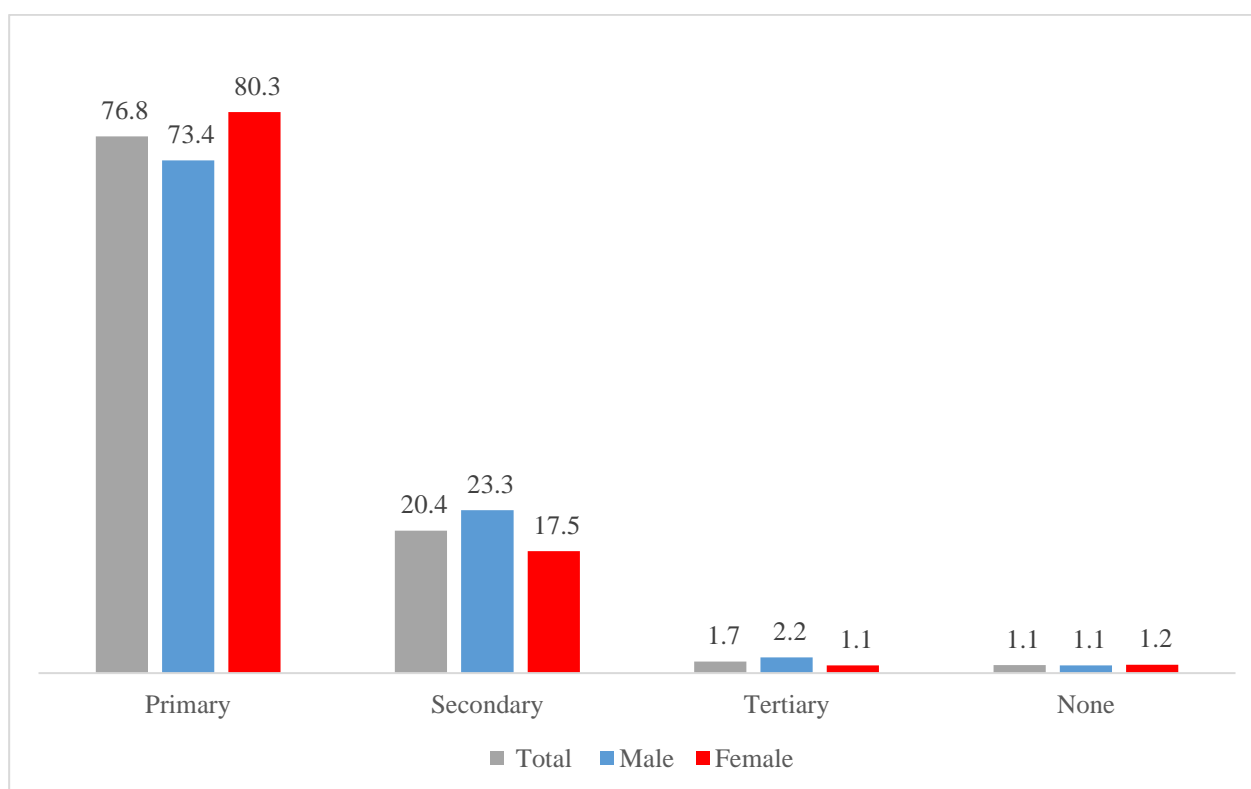

3.2 School Attendance

The 2018 PHC also collected information on school attendance and education level of the population aged 5 years and above. The majority of the population in the district had primary school as their highest level of education (76.8 percent). Those who had tertiary as their highest level of education were 1,7 percent, and 1.1 percent had never attended school.

In Neno district, a higher percentage of females (80.3 percent) had attended primary school compared to males (73.4 percent). Further, 23.3 percent of males as compared to 17.5 percent of females had attended secondary school. Furthermore, 2.2 percent of males and 1.1 percent females had attended tertiary education level (Figure 3.2).

4 Employed Persons by Industry.

Employed person is a person aged from 15 to 64 years who did work, apart from his or her own house work for at least an hour for pay or gain during the last 7 days.

The majority of the economically active population were employed in Agriculture forestry and fishing sector (83.2 percent). The proportion is higher among females (89.6 percent) compared to their male counterparts (75.9 percent).

The Construction sector accounts for 2.1 percent of the employed persons, whilst wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles contributes 0.8 percent (Table 4.1).

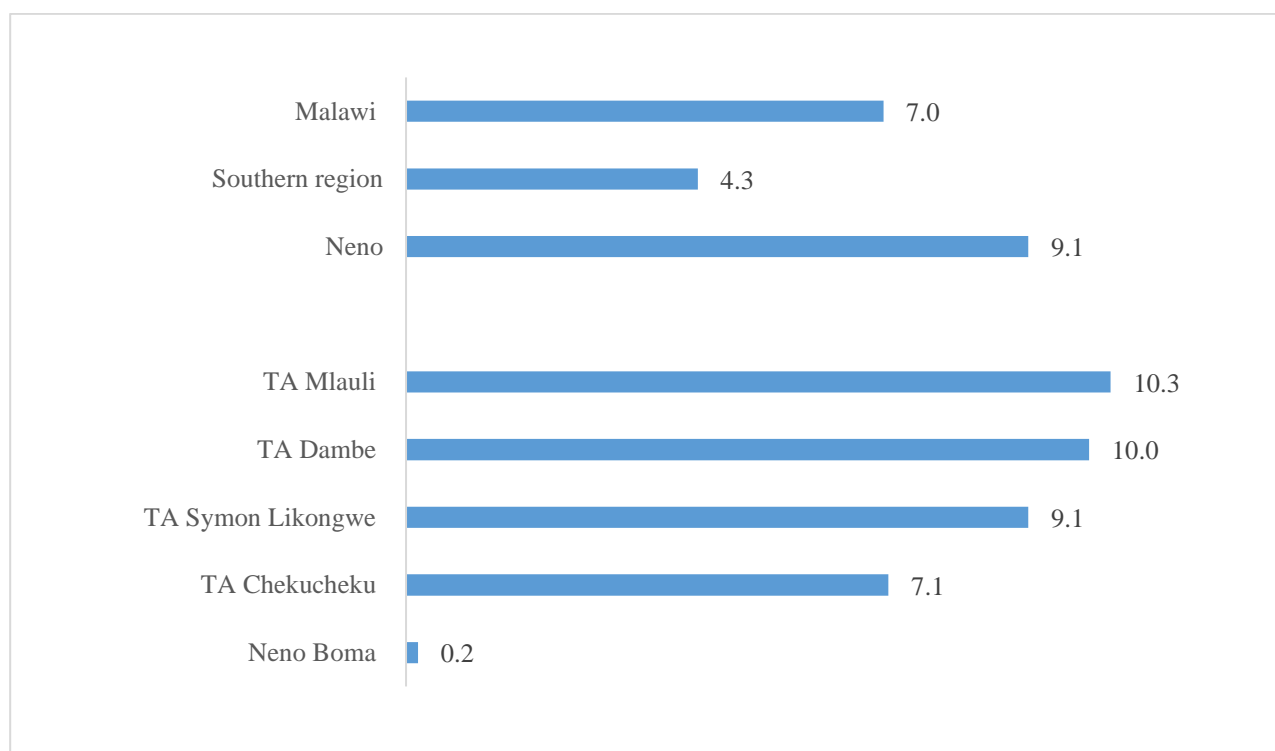

5 Households with No Toilet Facility

The 2018 PHC collected information on availability of toilet facilities at household level by type including those with no toilet facility.

In Neno district, 9.1 percent of households enumerated did not have access to a toilet facility. This percentage contribution is higher compared to Malawi (7.0 percent) and Southern region (4.3 percent). In terms of traditional authorities, TA Mlauli had the highest percentage of households with no toilet facility at 10.3 percent and was closely followed by TA Dambe which had 10.0 percent (Figure 5.1).
